PARENT EDUCATION

Triple P-**T**he **E**DGE on Parenting

The Edge is a Positive Parenting Program that promotes good communication and strong relationships between parents and children. This positive approach to parenting helps parents promote their children's development and manage their children's behavior in a constructive and caring way.

The Edge helps parents recognize the causes of common child behavior problems and encourage desirable behavior in their children. A variety of programs are available, depending on parents' and children's needs.

Video Game Information Session for Parents

DEVELOPMENTAL CHECK-UPS

Ages and Stages Program (ASQ)

The Ages and Stages program provides parents and caregivers with a "snapshot" of their child's first five years of development. This parent completed monitoring system allows you to become an expert of your child's growth, physically and socially before they enter school. The Ages and Stages Facilitator provides you with

activities, information and resources, and referrals when needed to further support your child's development. Cake and Friends! A Birth Month Birthday Party held in the Parent Link Centre Playroom on the 3rd Friday of every month for all children whose Birthday falls during that month. Let's Grow Together AND CARE

This is a play-based program that provides a resource rich environment in which parents and children can enjoy activities, play centres, art experiences and songs and stories together. For children 2 to 5 years of age.

Child Development

FAMILY SUPPORT

Chestermere Crime Reduction Partnership (CCRP)

Many social experts argue that today's youth are under more stress than ever before. Gang involvement, violence, proliferation of drugs, binge drinking and high risk sexual activity and heartbreak all make life tough for today's youth. There are some factors about teenage behaviour that contribute to an increase in the likelihood that they are at-risk. These include:

1. School life. Is your teen failing at school, are their grades dropping or are they in conflict with staff?
2. Family life. Is your teen rebellious? Do they argue often with their parents and/or siblings?
3. The law. Is your teen in trouble with authority? Do the police come calling to interview your child about certain incidents?
4. The community. Is your teen a dropout from sporting clubs, the church or other local group activities? Have they abandoned the things which once took pride of place in their life?
5. Unusual behavior. Is your teen prone to lose their cool beyond what might be considered normal? Are they angry and abusive? Have they dropped long-time friendships?

6. Depression. Is your teen spending long periods of time alone perhaps in their room? Have they been medically examined for depression? Do they seem listless and disinterested in most things?
 7. Sexuality. Is your teen sexually active? Do you know their partner or partners? Is your teen well-informed when it comes to the dangers of unprotected sex?
 8. Truthfulness. Have you caught your teen telling lies? Do they seem secretive and not open and forthcoming? Do you suspect them of stealing from home?
 9. Fear. Are you afraid of your teen? Are you worried that what you say or do will cause them to explode and use bad language? Has your teen threatened you or your family?
 10. Self-belief. Does your teen seem to lack confidence? Do they have an "I don't care" attitude to life?

What is 211?

211 is an easy-to-remember three-digit number providing free, confidential, multilingual access to information about the full range of community, social, health, and government services. Just as 911 now means access to emergency services, 211 is the pathway to these non-emergency human services. All 211 calls are answered by live operators, certified information specialists who assess each callers' needs and links them to the best available services and programs, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. A user-friendly version of the comprehensive, continually updated 211 database for each community or region can also be accessed on the internet.



Who uses 211?

211 offers a single point of access for anyone seeking non-emergency human services: individuals, families, people facing barriers because of language, poverty or personal difficulty, as well as professionals in government, business or community agencies. For example, people call 211 to locate:

- Social and recreational activities
- Volunteer opportunities

What is a Babysitting Co-op?

If you are a Mom and you need time, a babysitting co-op is right for you. A babysitting co-op enables member parents to leave their children and feel secure that they are being well cared for. They can save money by exchanging time, rather than money. It offers an outlet for members to socialize, meet with other community members and have their children socializing with other kids too. Members use a point system to track points. Points are swapped and managed by the secretary/administrator, which rotates each month. Meetings are held monthly, at the secretary/administrator's house, to discuss co-op business, review points and book future sits for the next month. E-mail communication is used in-between meetings to plan play dates and book sits. Co-ops can work with a number of different systems of childcare. If anything they compliment the services that are often offered in a community. Moms need a variety of options to work with busy schedules and even busier lives.

Babysitting co-ops are used to help mother do the job that they have been given. *The Chestermere Babysitting Co-op* is active and gaining members constantly.
